





- Laudable student participation in Cultural Competitions
 - d) 13 students participated in Yuva Spandan Spardha in Tribal Folk Dance.
 - e) 06 students participated in Yuva Spandan Spardha in one act play.
 - f) 02 Students participated in Yuva Spandan Spardha in Song Competition.

- Successful organization of Annual Competitions Essay writing, Elocution, Debating, Rangoli, Celebration of Days, Food Festival, etc.
- Proficient execution of teaching, learning and evaluation use of learner centered innovative teaching methodologies, ICT based teaching-learning, etc.
- > Effective execution of term end exams, oral test, practical, university exams, etc.

2. Weakness of the College:

- > M. A., M.Com and B.A. English Special Courses are run on unaided basis.
- > Separate Smart class rooms not available.
- > Shortage of Classroom as compared to the increasing strength of students.
- Limited funds/financial assistance/grants from State Government of Maharashtra/UGC and University.
- ➢ Need of Renovation of College building.
- > Students come from remote tribal areas without convenient bus/taxi facility.
- Socio-economic backward background of the tribal students.

3. Opportunities for the College:

- > Opportunities to introduce innovative courses at UG and PG level.
- > Opportunities for collaborative research.
- > To introduce certificate courses.
- > To start science faculty.
- > To organize national and international seminars/conferences/symposia.

4. Threats for the College:

- It is difficult to maintain expenditure of M. A., M.Com and B.A. English Special courses since unaided.
- > Shortage of class rooms for academic activities.
- > Non availability of Smart Classroom leads less use of ICT skills.
- > Non vocational course leads to less employment.

8. Plans of institution for next year:

- 1) To start course Advanced Diploma Course in 'Tourism and Hospitality' under the scheme of UGC's Community College.
- 2) To make running track and improve sports facilities for indoor games, gymnasium, etc.
- 3) Renovations of library and gymkhana into multipurpose hall for the indoor games.
- 4) To build full-fledged Seminar Hall to conduct the activities more proficiently.
- 5) To organize the State/National/International level seminars/workshops on recent themes.
- 6) To encourage teachers for the faculty development programs.
- 7) To enhance research activities and publications.
